Grace and peace be with you  
**and keep you in the love of Christ.**

The priest may say words of welcome and introduction.

## **Prayer of Preparation**

**Father of glory, holy and eternal,  
look upon us now in power and mercy.  
May your strength overcome our weakness,  
your radiance transform our blindness,  
and your Spirit draw us to that love  
shown and offered to us by your Son,  
our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen**

**Or:**

**Heavenly Father, all hearts are open to you.  
No secrets are hidden from you.  
Purify us with the fire of your Holy Spirit  
that we may love and worship you faithfully,  
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

# Gloria in Excelsis

On Sundays and Festivals, the Gloria is sung,  
except in Advent and Lent:

**Glory in the highest to the God of heaven!  
Peace to all your people through the earth be given!  
Mighty God and Father, thanks and praise we bring,  
Singing Alleluias to our heavenly king.  
Jesus Christ is risen, God the Father's Son!  
With the Holy Spirit you are Lord alone!**

**Lamb once killed for sinners, all our guilt to bear,  
Show us now your mercy, now receive our prayer.  
Christ the world's true Saviour, high and holy One,  
seated now and reigning from your Father's throne:  
Lord and God, we praise you! Highest heaven adores:  
In the Father's glory, all the praise be yours!**

Let us pray.

The priest says the Collect of the day  
and the people respond **Amen.**

Please sit for the readings.

# Proclamation of the Word

A reading from ...

...

This is the word of the Lord.

**Thanks be to God.**

A psalm is said or sung.

If it is said, the reader will announce the response, which the people say between each stanza.

On a Sunday or Festival, a second reading is read.

# Gospel reading

If you're able, please stand.

A Gospel Acclamation may be said or sung, such as:

**Diolch i ti, yr Hollalluog Dduw,  
Am yr Efengyl, am yr Efengyl,  
am yr Efengyl sanctaidd.**

**Haleliwia! Haleliwia! Haleliwia! Amen. (Repeat)**

Tune: Diolch i ti, Huw Angel  
Emynau'r LLan 192

In Lent, all Alleluias are omitted.

The Lord be with you,  
**and also with you.**

Listen to the Gospel of Christ ✠ according to Saint **N**:  
**Glory to you, O Lord.**

...

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

**Praise to you, O Christ.**

## Sermon

A sermon is preached on Sundays and Festivals;  
Please sit for the sermon.

## The Creed

If you're able, please stand to sing:

**We believe in God the Father,  
God almighty, by whose plan  
earth and heaven sprang to being,  
all created things began.**

**We believe in Christ the Saviour,  
Son of God in human frame,  
virgin-born, the child of Mary  
upon whom the Spirit came.**

**Christ, who on the cross forsaken,  
like a lamb to slaughter led,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
he descended to the dead.  
We believe in Jesus risen,  
heaven's King to rule and reign,  
to the Father's side ascended  
till as judge he comes again.**

**We believe in God the Spirit;  
in one Church, below, above:  
saints of God in one communion,  
one in holiness and love.  
So by faith, our sins forgiven,  
Christ our Saviour, Lord and friend,  
we shall rise with him in glory  
to the life that knows no end.**

Please kneel or sit. Prayers are offered for the Church, the world, and those in need.

This response, or another, may be used:

Lord, in your mercy

**Hear our prayer**

The following may be used for the departed:

Let all the faithful departed in Christ rest in peace

✠ **and rise in glory.**

At the end:

Merciful Father,

**accept these prayers**

**for the sake of your Son,**

**our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.**

# Liturgy of the Sacrament

## The Peace

If you're able, please stand.

The priest may introduce the Peace with a sentence.

The peace of the Lord be with you always  
**and also with you.**

A hymn may be sung.

## The Thanksgiving

The priest gives thanks for God's gifts,  
by themselves if a hymn is sung.

Otherwise, the people respond each time:  
**Blessed be God for ever.**

The following may be said:

Pray, dear friends, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

**May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.**

## The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you.

**And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.

**We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

We celebrate the grace of God made visible in Jesus.

...for ever praising you and saying/singing:

The Sanctus and Benedictus are sung:

**Holy, most holy, all holy the Lord,  
in power and wisdom forever adored:  
the earth and the heavens are full of your love;  
our joyful hosannas re-echo above.**

**✘ Blessed most blessed, all blessed is he,  
whose life makes us whole  
and whose death sets us free,  
who comes in the name of the Father of light;  
let endless hosannas resound in the height.**

The priest continues with the Eucharistic Prayer.

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

**Christ has died.**

**Christ is risen.**

**Christ will come in glory.**

We recall Christ's works and pray for the Holy Spirit.

...for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Silence; please kneel or sit.

The priest introduces the Lord's Prayer,  
in these words or using a seasonal sentence.

As our Saviour taught us, we boldly pray:

**Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy name;  
thy kingdom come; thy will be done;  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation;  
but deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the kingdom,  
the power and the glory,  
for ever and ever. Amen.**

# Breaking of the Bread

The priest breaks the consecrated bread:

We break this bread

to share in the body of Christ.

**Though we are many, we are one body,  
for we all share in one bread.**

# **Agnus Dei**

**O Lamb of God, come cleanse our hearts  
and take our sins away.**

**O Lamb of God, your grace impart,  
and let our guilty fear depart,  
have mercy, Lord, we pray;  
have mercy, Lord, we pray.**

**O Lamb of God, our lives restore,  
our guilty souls release.**

**Into our lives your Spirit pour  
and let us live for evermore  
in perfect heav'nly peace;  
in perfect heav'nly peace.**

# Giving of Communion

The priest invite the people to receive communion in these words:

God's holy gifts for God's holy people.

**Jesus Christ is holy,  
Jesus Christ is Lord,  
to the glory of God the Father.**

Or:

Jesus is the Lamb of God  
who takes away the sins of the world.  
Happy are those who are called to his supper.  
**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,  
but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

Or:

Come, let us receive the body and blood of our Lord  
Jesus Christ, given for us, and feed on him in our hearts  
by faith with thanksgiving.

✠ The priest receives communion  
on behalf of those unable to do so.

\*

The people receive; a hymn may be sung or silence kept.

## The Sending Out

If you're able, please stand.

Give thanks to the Lord for he is gracious:

**his love is everlasting.**

The priest says a post-communion prayer,  
or leads the people in the following:

**We thank you, Father,  
for feeding us with the body and blood  
of your Son in this holy sacrament,  
through which we are assured  
of the hope of eternal life.**

**We offer ourselves to you as a living sacrifice.  
Keep us in the fellowship of his body, the Church,  
and send us out in the power of your Spirit  
to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.**

A hymn may be sung before or after the blessing.

# Dismissal

The Lord be with you.

**And also with you.**

The priest says this or another sentence:

The peace of God which is beyond all understanding  
guard your hearts in the knowledge and love of God  
and of his Son Jesus Christ,

...and the blessing of God almighty,

✠ the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,

be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

or the blessing in Welsh:

...a bendith Duw Hollalluog,


✠ y Tad, y Mab, a'r Ysbryd Glân,

a fo yn eich plith ac a drigo gyda chwi yn wastad. **Amen.**

The priest says this or another dismissal:

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

✠ **In the name of Christ. Amen.**

Please remain standing  
until the priest has passed you.
